









Editors Ramblings!



Cockle Island Members RYA Interview






Members of Cockle Island Boat Club have been enjoying weekly racing as part of their 'Wrinklies' series which has been running at the club for close to 50 years.

Northern Ireland, as both will mark their 50th anniversary.


Willie Wickens remembers the birth of RYA Northern Ireland well, stating: "We heard that the Royal Yachting Association had a branch in Northern Ireland so we

wrote to them to apply to be affiliated.


"We then got this letter back explaining that they would be keen to have us and we've been in it ever since."

"I'm privileged to be the Commodore this year. It's been a great job working with the guys and girls.

"We even meet over the Winter on Wednesday nights and have a 'get together'. All the people in the club can then get together and it maintains that comradeship."


