# **CIBC Sailing Awards 2023**



2023 sailing season was very challenging due to some unpleasant conditions and strong winds, other times there was little or no wind.

The number of boats competing in the various series had improved on the previous season, with the Wrinklies again being the best supported.

Thanks to those Boats and Crew who did turn out to support the racing programme. The Sailing Committee would like to thank all those members who acted as Race Officers, especially those on the shore battery for the Crowe Cup series.

#### AWARDS:

Round the Lough; 5 races were scheduled; 2 were cancelled. Nancy M and Dovelet tied for second place with 2 races completed, but LARA won the series after completing all 3 races.

Wrinklies; Best supported series of season with 11 boats taking part. 17 races were scheduled with 11 to count.

Final result was Maximoose in 2nd place with 36 points, but a win for BIRD of SUNSET with 44 points.

Wrinklies Offshore to Glenarm ; The race was well supported despite the very light airs. Several boats managed to sail the entire race with Seahaven finishing in 2 nd place behind HE-CLA who was first.

A very enjoyable meal and social gathering took place following the race.

Crowe Cup; This series was very competitive but fraught with weather problems.

18 races were scheduled, 4 were cancelled, 2 were abandoned and 1 was timed out.

Ishtar and Bird of Sunset went into the last race on equal points (31) only to have to abandon it

due to light airs. Bird of Sunset had 3 wins during the series, but ISHTAR had 5 making them 2023 winners.

Round the Islands; 6 races scheduled , 1 abandoned and 1 cancelled. 11 boats competed Series .won by

LARA who was only boat to complete 4 races.

Portpatrick Offshore ; Abandoned due to light airs.

Duncan McInnes Trophy; awarded to Boat attending the most Regattas on Lough. Won by

the AncientMariner on Hecla, Kenny Walsh. T J PLATING CUP for September Series; 8 races scheduled, 4 were cancelled due to weather.

Plexus finished in 2nd place behind BIRD of SUNSET who won series. Pursuit Race. Race took place in light airs with Herby Lysk again acting as starter/ Race Officer. Race won by BIRD of SUNSET with Scarlet in 2nd place Endeavour Trophy. Awarded to sailor or crew who puts in a good effort. This year the sailing committee would like to acknowledge the competitive spirit and support for the racing programme and the cup is presented to MAXIMOOSE.
